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

Meet Stephanie

21 YEARS OF AT VANDERHEYDEN

Tell us a little about yourself and what brought you to Vanderheyden.

I just celebrated my 21st work anniversary. Prior to coming to Vanderheyden I taught preschool for 14 years. and I was a waitress at a restaurant down the street. Many of the school staff at the time including school secretary Pat Mahar used to come in on Fridays after work. They suggested I come and work with them and I did. I haven't looked back since. I've enjoyed every moment, being part of the Vanderheyden family. At one point, I even had the privilege of working beside both my daughter Erika and my son Stephen.

What is your job at Vanderheyden?

I am a certified teachers assistant, but I've been teaching Earth Science for the past eight years as a long-term substitute. This has inspired me to go back to school. I just earned my Bachelor of Science in May. This month I started school, working towards a Master of Arts in Teaching at Empire State University.

What has your time at Vanderheyden taught you?

Vanderheyden has taught me the importance of being a lifelong learner. We are all teachable. I learn something from my students each and every day.

Can you share a memory or story of a youth in your care?

There are so many amazing events and experiences here at Vanderheyden. I have enjoyed every first day of school, Student Council carnival, prom & graduation. This year all 14 of my students taking the Earth Science regents exam passed! To say that I am so very proud of each of them is an understatement.

Why should someone work at Vanderheyden?

Every day is a new opportunity to foster and motivate our students. At Vanderheyden there are endless opportunities to make an impact and a difference in the life of a child. This is the most rewarding job that you will ever love.

Tell us about the activities or practices that you have at Vanderheyden that have made a positive impact on the individuals we serve.

I am the student council advisor at our school. We organize events at our school and our community as well. Teaching my students to do their part and providing them with opportunities to help others in need is essential in shaping our future citizens. We have volunteered at: the Ronald McDonald House, Van Rensselaer Manor Nursing Home, Equinox- Thanksgiving Community Dinner and Capital Region Food Bank of Albany. For the past 8 years I have facilitated our Student Peer Mentoring program. Through modeling, support and encouragement students build sustainable relationships and empower one another. We focus on team building through positive cooperative experiences aimed at fostering talents, interests, and personal growth.

Meet Jeremy

GIVEN A SECOND CHANCE AT VANDERHEYDEN

Where are you from?

I was born in Missouri, but I like to say I am from everywhere. We moved around a lot and ended up in Colorado. When I was 6, my siblings and I were taken from our mother and placed in the foster care system. We all ended up being adopted by a family in Colorado who soon moved to New York. Thats how I ended up here!

What is something you are passionate about?

I like working out, weightlifting and being strong. I want to see myself become a life coach and have my own office. I want to be a dad one day. Growing up with two siblings, I always knew I wanted to have my own children. I want to work towards getting my own apartment and be more independent.

How long have you been a part of the Vanderheyden Family?

I never really adjusted to my new family, and I started looking for other things to make me happy. I started hanging out with people I later learned were a bad influence. At 17, I moved out, and not long after that I was homeless. Struggling with drug addiction, I ended up in the hospital more times than I can remember. After years on the streets, my peer advocate and therapist at the homeless shelter connected me with Vanderheyden's services. I always knew I wanted to do more with my life, I just did not have the tools to make myself better. In February of 2023, I started living at a Vanderheyden Independent Residential Alternative.

Who is a staff member that helps you?

Destiney has been there with me since the beginning. What I like about her is that she is always fair and consistent. She listens to me, gives great advice and always looking for ways to help me. Blake is someone I look up to. He is a dad, and models to me what a good dad is supposed to look like. He pushes me to be better and is my gym buddy.

What advice would you give someone who is coming to Vanderheyden?

Be ready for change. Vanderheyden has kept me sane! I struggled with depression for many years, but Vanderheyden gave me housing, opportunities and someone to talk to. I actually feel like staff want to help and be there for me. They have given me a lot of stability.
